School Bus	Available when not in use by the school. Owned by private contractor Location: Quorn Area School Ph 86486101
Pichi Richi Railway	In 1973, the Pichi Richi Railway Preservation Society was formed. This Society now maintains a stretch of track between Quorn and Woolshed Flat. Workshops and a museum with a large collection of historical narrow gauge rolling stock, are open for inspection by appointment only. Historical Town Trail	Directions for an interesting Historical Buildings Walk of Quorn, are available at the Quorn Area School. Brochure available from the Tourist Office, Seventh St Quorn. 5433
Lions Park	Collection of Historical Farm Machinery used by the early settlers in the Quorn District. BBQ facilities are available. Location: Opposite Quorn Swimming Pool on the corner of Pt Augusta and Arden Vale Rds. Walking distance from the Quorn Outdoor Ed. Centre.
Quorn Cemetery	1km from Quorn (Wilmington Rd)
Devil's Peak	Devils Peak (called Devils Punch Bowl on original 1851 pastoral maps). Location: 10km from Quorn. Richman Valley Rd. Turn onto Devils Peak Rd, 3km from Quorn. Follow road through to car park. Trail begins at this point. Contact District Council to see if it is open 86486031
Waukerie Falls	Location: 16km from Quorn (Richman Valley Rd). Leave your vehicle at the gate opposite Olive Grove and follow the track down the creek. The Falls are upstream to the right. Most times, as to be expected, the falls aren't running. Marked walking trail from this location through to Woolshed Flat. Approx 5.5km
Dutchman's Stern Conservation Park	Location: Access track to be found 6.5kms from Quorn, Arden Vale Rd. The Park is only 3kms from main road.
Arden Vale Gorge	Scenic lookout. Location: 16km from Quorn (Yarrah Vale Rd)

Warren Gorge	Spectacular rock formations. Creeks usually have water. Location: 22km from Quorn (Arden Vale Rd)
Proby's Grave	The original owner of Kanyaka Station was Hugh Proby, who drowned while crossing the Willochra Creek in 1852. Location: 35km from Quorn (Arden Vale Rd) turn right at the Y Junction just before Buckaringa Gorge.
Kanyaka Ruins	Ruins of the 16 room main homestead and its many outbuildings. Up to 70 families were accommodated on this property in the mid 1870'2. Across the creek is a small cemetery, Further along the creek are ruins of the woolshed. Death Rock (or The Rock Hole) is a short distance further on. This large 7 metre high Quartzite rock is beside a permanent spring-fed water hole. Location: 42km from Quorn (Hawker Rd)
Yourumbulla Caves	Aboriginal Art Sites and panoramic views. Location: 54km from Quorn (Hawker Rd) Check with Tourist Information Centre as to whether they're open for tourists due to upgrades/maintenance. Ph 86486419
Yarrah Vale lookout	Scenic Lookout. Location: 16km north from Quorn. Yarrah Vale Road
The Heysen Trail	The Heysen Trail stretches from Cape Jarvis south of Adelaide on Fleurieu Peninsular to the Parachilna Gorge in the Central Flinders Ranges. There are some short sections and branches of the trail that provide some excellent walks. Due to fire restrictions from Nov 1 st to April 30 th the Heysen Trail is closed. (Check with District Council)
Mount Brown Conservation Park	Heysen Trail to Mt Brown. Follow creek trail west for 1km, turn south away from Waukauri Creek at the old tank. Trail is marked and can be followed to the crest of the peak.
